

### Jackets fail against Bourbon

One would be inclined to agree with coach Henderson's statement following last week's 59-45 loss to Bourbon County. "If we would have played as well in the first half as we did in the second half, it might have been a different ball game."

It was in the first half of that game Tuesday that fans at Bourbon County's gymnasium were treated to a high-scoring contest. The Jackets' offense exploded for 14 straight points and jumped on top 20-10 before Nicholas County could muster a second period score.

There were highlights to be found in the second half, however. Highlights in the fact that a much smaller Nicholas County team out-scraped the Colonels on the boards for a rebounding edge of 29-19. Highlights also as successive baskets by Dwayne Williams, Joe Ruddell, Tony Ritchie, and Steve Curtright pulled the Jackets back to within striking distance at 35-25. But nine points was as close as the Bluejackets could come, as a bigger superior Bourbon County squad forced turnovers and muscled in baskets to hold onto their lead.

The pattern of the game was established very early in the first quarter. Bourbon County played a sticky defense and forced countless turnovers by an obviously intimidated Nicholas County club. On offense the Colonels relied on the inside work of Craig Summers and the overall fine performance by Charlie Farmer, who was the game's leading scorer with 18. 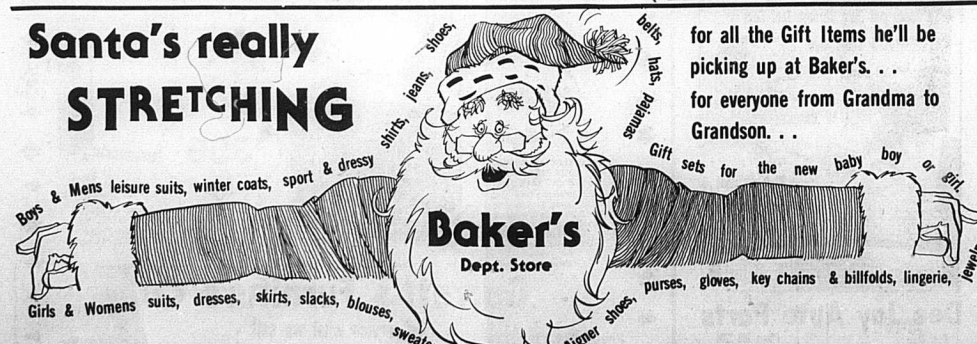
