Christmas is sneaking up on us and with so many things to do you may want to start making plans for some menus for different occasions. Here are some pie recipes that are easy to make and delicious.

CHOCOLATE ALMOND PIE
Dissolve 1 teaspoon instant coffee in 2 tablespoon water. Add broken 7/8 cup chocolate almond candy bar, stirring over low heat until melted. Cool thoroughly.

Mix about 1/2 cups graded coconut with 2 tablespoons melted butter. Shape into pie plate and bake at 325 degrees until golden brown (10 minutes). Cool thoroughly.

To chocolate mixture, add 4 cups of whipped cream, folding in. Heat into crust and freeze for several hours, or overnight. (It won't freeze alone.) Top with more whipped cream and toasted sliced almonds before serving.

Remove pie from freezer before using and put it in refrigerator. It is delicious made with commercial whipping cream, but less rich.

BOURBON PIE
1 cup sugar
1/2 tablespoon flour
2 eggs, well beaten
1 cup Bourbon

JAM CAKE
1 cup white sugar
2 cups shortening
2 cups flour
1 heaping teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon cinnamon
2 teaspoons cloves
2 teaspoons allspice
1 cup blackberry jam
1 egg cold strong black coffee
1 cup cold water
