

Public service use authorized for symbol

Public service use of the national Bicentennial symbol has been authorized, and is being encouraged, by the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration (ARBA). Under the policy, the symbol may be used where public service space is traditionally offered free to carry public service messages.

Examples of such use would be on milk cartons, matchbooks, stationery, on the sides of trucks and buses, as a leader on motion pictures, on billboards, and on magazine, newspaper and certain authorized product wrappers.

The symbol cannot be used in a way which would increase the intrinsic value or imply endorsement of the product or service. Used in this manner, the symbol would also be accompanied by the legend "Support Your Bicentennial," "Discover Bicentennial America," or "Official Bicentennial Symbol." Generally, there should also be a brief informative and positive message relating to the Bicentennial.

various ARBA-sponsored Alliances. The nation's news media are encouraged to use it in connection with news and editorial coverage of the Bicentennial. The tourist and travel industry has also been given general authority for its use.

Specific written ARBA authorization is required for public service use of the symbol. Such use must be in accordance with guidelines in the Official Graphics Standards Manual. John W. Warner, Bicentennial Administrator, who has urged Americans to display the symbol, including flying the Bicentennial flag, said he hoped many businesses, associations, and other groups would use the symbol as a public service so that it will become even more familiar to the nation's citizens.

The Bicentennial symbol takes the form of a 5-pointed star, surrounded by continuous red, white and blue stripes which form a second star. It is derived from the stars, stripes and colors of the United States flag.

The ARBA has previously authorized use of the symbol for purposes of identification, official recognition of projects and programs, public information and on licensed official commemorative items.

Authorized users include federal and state agencies, Bicentennial Communities, programs that have received official recognition and members of Nurses Assoc. to meet the Kentucky Nurses' Association, District No. 20, will have its monthly meeting Tuesday, Jan. 6, at 7 p.m. It will be held in the Hayswood Hospital Dining Room. 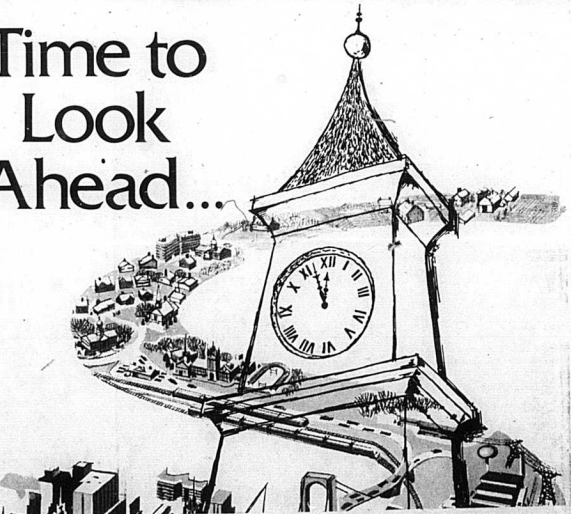

Lexington Center now over three-fourths complete

An entertainment and convention center in downtown Lexington is Oct. 1975, less than a year from now. Lexington Center, with its sports arena, convention-exhibition hall, retail mall, and on-site hotel, will give Lexington a complete entertainment, sports, convention and meeting facility for the first time in its history.

Dominating the project, and uppermost in the mind of University of Kentucky basketball fans, is Rupp Arena, a cavernous arena built for basketball that will have a seating capacity of nearly 21,000, making it the largest arena in the nation.

Rupp Arena, named after Adolph Rupp, is a multi-purpose facility, adaptable to such diverse events as basketball, indoor tennis, ice shows, circuses, horse shows and musical events.



The facility is being sound-engineered. Continued on page 11

WILDCATS' NEW LAIR—Rupp Arena, with a seating capacity of nearly 21,000, will be the home court for the University of Kentucky basketball Wildcats beginning with the 1975-76 season.

Rupp, UK's legendary basketball coach, will replace Memorial Coliseum as the home of the basketball Wildcats. Its greatly increased seating capacity will allow more tickets to go on sale to the public.

Surrounding Rupp Arena are the convention-exhibition hall, retail mall and planned 377-room Lexington Center Hyatt House hotel. All of these components will be structurally attached to one another, allowing visitors to go from one to another while remaining inside at all times.

Plans are being made for a grand opening that will involve all sections of the complex.

The opening of Rupp Arena will probably include a week of one-night attractions that would appeal to different age groups. The second week would be devoted to a major family attraction, such as a circus or ice show, that would offer something for all age groups.

At the same time the convention-exhibition hall, with its 70,000-square feet of space, would be host to an event such as a sport and boat or hobby and gift show.

Out-of-town visitors to Lexington Center could stay at the Hyatt House, a 15-story luxury hotel that will include a six-story atrium, or open lobby, an architectural feature for which the Hyatt Corporation is well known.

Restaurants and exclusive shops will be found in the retail mall, a 70,000-square foot shopping and dining area that will be the focal point of the center.

Of course, one of the feature opening attractions will be the appearance of the Kentucky Wildcats in their first home game in Rupp Arena, sometime around the first of December.

Rupp Arena is in the final stages of construction, lacking only seats, a sound system and finishing touches. The arena will have a seating capacity of 10,000 on the lower level, with a capacity of over 12,000 on the upper level.

The lower level of Rupp Arena will be highlighted by brightly colored seating sections. The upper section will be in a darker color.

Thus, when just the lower 10,000 seats are in use, the upper section can be darkened, giving the feeling of being in a smaller area.
