AMENDMENT TO AUG. 28, 1975 PUBLICATION
Date January 15, 1976

The Nicholas County Board of Education today announced its policy for free meals, free milk, and reduced-price meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals and milk served in schools under the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast and/or Special Milk Program. Local school officials have adopted the following family size and income criteria for determining eligibility: **FAMILY-SIZE AND INCOME SCALE FOR FREE MEALS, FREE MILK AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS**

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents. Additional forms are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a family has foster children living with them and wish to apply for such meals and milk for them, they should contact the school. If a family member becomes unemployed or if family's size and income changes, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for reduced price meals, or for additional benefits such as free meals and milk if the family income falls at or below the levels shown above.

In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of his race, sex, color, or national origin.

Under the provision of the policy the school principal will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official he may make a request either orally or in writing to Donald G. Elder whose address is Main Street, Carlisle, Kentucky for a hearing to appeal the decision.

The hearing procedures are outlined in the policy. A complete copy of the policy is on file in each school and in the office of the District Superintendent where it may be reviewed by any interested party.
