

Text of the Constitution of the United States

Preamble

We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby adopt this Constitution for the United States of America.

ARTICLE I

LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT Two Houses Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives...

Section 2. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof for six years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the United States...

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof for six years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the United States...

Section 4. The Senators and Representatives shall receive for their Services a Compensation, which shall be ascertained from time to time by the Law which may be passed by the majority of both Houses of Congress...

Section 5. The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments. When the President of the United States is tried, the Chief Justice shall preside. No Person shall be convicted without the Concurrence of two-thirds of the Members present...

Section 6. The President and Vice President shall hold their Office for a Term of four Years; and no Person shall be elected to either Office until he has attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States...

Section 7. The President shall have the Power to fill up all Vacancies that may happen during the Term of his Office, by Appointment, as near the End of the Term as may be...

Section 8. The President shall have the Power to grant Reprieves and Pardons for all Offences against the United States, except in Cases of Impeachment.

Section 9. The President shall have the Power to nominate and, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, to appoint and discontinue any one of his Officers, and all other Officers of the United States...

Section 10. No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation; send Ambassadors, or send Ministers or Consuls, or grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal, or enter into any War, or do any other Thing, which may in any Manner impede the Execution of the Powers of the United States...

Section 11. The President shall have the Power to receive Ambassadors and other public Ministers.

Section 12. The President and Vice President shall hold their Office for a Term of four Years; and no Person shall be elected to either Office until he has attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States...

Section 13. The President shall have the Power to grant Reprieves and Pardons for all Offences against the United States, except in Cases of Impeachment.

Section 14. The President shall have the Power to nominate and, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, to appoint and discontinue any one of his Officers, and all other Officers of the United States...

Section 15. No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation; send Ambassadors, or send Ministers or Consuls, or grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal, or enter into any War, or do any other Thing, which may in any Manner impede the Execution of the Powers of the United States...

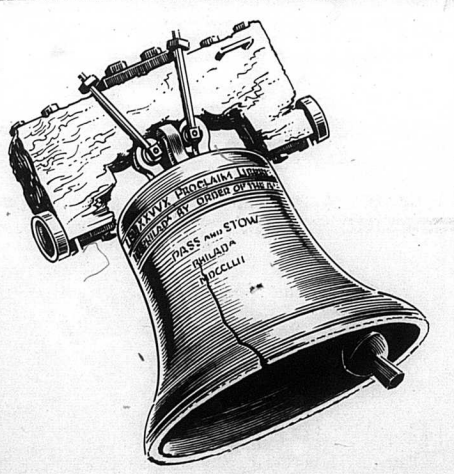

Text of the Constitution of the United States

ARTICLE VII ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION The Ratification of the Constitution of the United States shall be valid as to the States as ratifying the Same.

ARTICLE VIII The Congress shall have the Power to regulate the Commerce with foreign Nations, to regulate the Commerce among the several States, and to regulate the Commerce with the Indian Tribes...

ARTICLE IX The Migration of Persons into any State from any other State shall not be subject to any Laws of the State to which they migrate...

ARTICLE X Right to Keep Arms A well regulated Militia is necessary to the security of a free State. The right of the People to keep and bear Arms shall not be infringed.

ARTICLE XI Federal Judiciary Section 1. The judicial Power shall extend to all Cases, in Law and Equity, arising under this Constitution...

ARTICLE XII Presidential Electors Section 1. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State...

ARTICLE XIII National Debt Section 1. The United States shall keep Faith with the Public Debt. No State shall be held liable for the Public Debt of any other State.

ARTICLE XIV Amendment of the Constitution Section 1. The whole Number of Amendments proposed shall not exceed three. Two-thirds of both Houses must concur to pass any one.

ARTICLE XV Extension of Suffrage Section 1. The right of Citizens of the United States to elect Representatives in Congress shall not be denied or abridged by the States...

ARTICLE XVI Executive Power Section 1. The executive Power shall be vested in a President of the United States, who shall hold his Office for a Term of four Years...

ARTICLE XVII Senate Electors Section 1. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Electors in that State...

ARTICLE XVIII Election of President and Vice President Section 1. The Electors shall meet in separate States, and vote for President and Vice President...

ARTICLE XIX Relations of States Section 1. Full Faith and Credit shall be given to all Acts, Judgments, and Proceedings of any Court having Jurisdiction of the Subject...

ARTICLE XX National Debt, Supremacy of National Law Section 1. The United States shall keep Faith with the Public Debt. No State shall be held liable for the Public Debt of any other State.

ARTICLE XXI Presidential Succession Section 1. In Case of the Death or Resignation of the President, or in Case of his Impeachment and Conviction, the Vice President shall become President...

ARTICLE XXII Presidential Term Section 1. No Person shall be elected to the Office of President or Vice President more than two Times...

ARTICLE XXIII Presidential Powers Section 1. The President shall have the Power to nominate and, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, to appoint and discontinue any one of his Officers...

ARTICLE XXIV Presidential Qualifications Section 1. No Person shall be elected to the Office of President until he has attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States...

ARTICLE XXV Presidential Vacancies Section 1. In Case of the Death or Resignation of the President, or in Case of his Impeachment and Conviction, the Vice President shall become President...
