Fall deer hunt announced

Two weekends this fall have been set aside by officials of the Lexington-Hill Grass Army Depot to permit bow hunters to hunt deer on the depot's Blue Grass Activity near Richmond, Ky.

The bow hunters will be allowed to hunt only for buck having at least one forked antler. Hunting will be discontinued when the quota is reached or military operations make it necessary to discontinue hunting.

Hunters are selected by a lottery system and those selected are required to pay a \$10 charge on the day of the hunt. The money will be used to improve the depot's wildlife habitat.

Hunters under 14 will not be permitted to hunt, and those in the 14-18 age category must be accompanied by an adult.
