**New ad program at MCC this fall**

A new program in Industrial Electrical Technology will be offered at Mayville Community College when classes begin in August, 1976.

More than two years in planning, the program has been developed by Mayville Community College with the assistance of representatives from industrial corporations operating within the area. Unlike programs in engineering technology offered in other community colleges, the Mayville program will attempt to specifically train young people at a collegiate level to move into advanced positions with employers operating in the student's home territory.

The "all in one package" program will include training in industrial electricity, hydraulics, industrial machines, processes and controls. The estimated cost of equipment, instructional supplies, space etc. for implementing the program is estimated at around \$50,000. An advisory board composed of representatives from seven local industries will continue to monitor and work with the program to insure that students acquire skill and techniques which will allow them to find ready employment in the Mayville community.

## Local bus drivers to attend school in Winchester Aug. 12-13

Eight Nicholas county bus drivers are scheduled to attend the Kentucky Department of Education bus driver training school to be held at William G. Cockrigh Middle School in Winchester on Aug. 12-13.

Superintendent Don Elder said that all drivers must go to the school every other year. All new drivers are also required to attend.

The school will serve bus drivers from Nicholas, Bath, Bourbon, Clark, Estill, Fayette, Fleming, Harrison, Madison, Menifee, Montgomery, Powell and Robertson counties, Berea Independent, Paris Independent and Richmond Independent school systems.

More than 2,500 of the state's 6,000 bus drivers are expected to participate.

James said the training program will include instruction from the state police concerning Kentucky's traffic laws as well as from officials of the Education Department.

Topics include "Pupil Discipline," "Defensive Driving," "Emergency and First Aid Procedures," "Public Relations," "Loading and Unloading Procedure," "Pupil Management," "Kentucky Administrative Regulations" and "Preventive Maintenance."

In a memorandum to state school board superintendent and transportation supervisors, Jones noted that over 550,000 school children are transported each day in state school buses. He attributed the safety of those children to "the attitudes and skills" of the bus drivers, calling the bus driver "the single most important person in the most dangerous of a bus driver's duties."

Jones said that while Kentucky's bus drivers "have achieved a commendable safety record over the years," it is important that they be made aware of state laws and regulations, means of controlling students, and emergency measures. He emphasized the importance of loading and unloading school children, calling that proced-

ure the most dangerous of a bus driver's duties.
