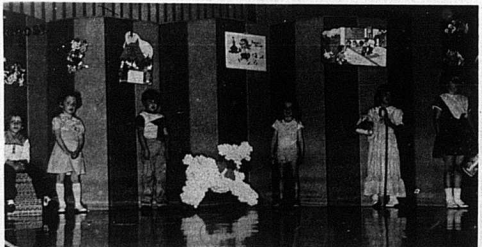

Baseball leagues play last week

Babe Ruth
In the first game of the second half season of Babe Ruth baseball, the Dodgers defeated the Giants 5-2 in a close game that went seven innings. Billy Minton pitched the losing game and Tim Moreland got his fifth straight win. The Giants got their two runs from five hits. Making these hits were P. Leitcher, M. Hatton (3), M. Sargeant and Billy Minton who got a base hit and credit for the two RBI's. The team made two errors, one which enabled the winning run to score. The Dodgers got six hits from J. Anderson, Tim Moreland, G. Williams and Tom Moreland who made three. The team made no errors in the game.

The second game of the night resulted in the Senators defeating the A's 13-7. Mark Ruddle got the win. The A's had pitching trouble trying three pitchers. Mike Boykin, replaced by Mike Wells in the first and then Timmy Basin in the fifth. Mike Wells got the loss for the A's. Nine hits were made by the Senator players: D. Markland, T. Reid, M. Ruddle, J. Randolph, C. Russell (2), C. Kenney and M. Coburn (2). The team committed only two errors. Only three hits were made by the A's by M. Matton (2) and T. Banata. The team made three errors and hit into a double play.

The A's fell in defeat Friday night when they played the Giants. Both teams had good ball but the Senators were in a hitting mood and managed to get 11 hits off the losing pitcher, Mike Matton. Mike Hatton, the winning pitcher, allowed only four hits from the A's by M. Matton, T. Ockerman, M. Ritchie and K. Gilchrist. Making the hits for the Giants were G. Willis, Billy Minton (4), M. Hatton (2), B. Bretz (2), and Mark Vireo (2). The A's walked six players and made three errors. The Giants walked only three and committed four errors to win by a score of 7-3.

In the second game of the night, the Senators secured first place by defeating the Dodgers 6-3. Tom Moreland did his best for the Dodgers by allowing only one hit, a triple by Jeff Randolph, but the team committed five errors and Tom walked ten players on base. Todd Allison helped out in the fourth inning by retiring the Senators in order. Chris Kenney picked up the win for the Senators, allowing three hits and walking five players. The team made three errors.

The Minor League games that were rained out on June 3 will be played Sunday, June 13 at 1:30 p.m. at Calvin Denton. The Cubs will take on the Reds and the Dodgers will go against the Athletics.

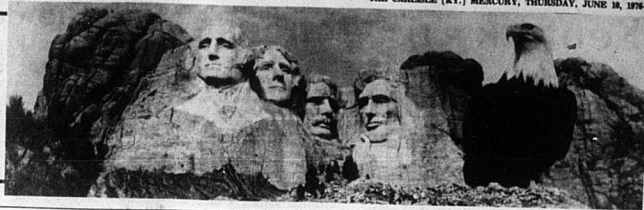
