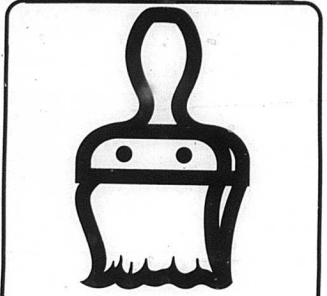


**Moorefield Methodist Church to have Revival**

**Bee payments approved**

Paul E. Hall, Executive Director, Nicholas County ASCS Office, announced today that the Secretary of Agriculture is authorized to make payments to beekeepers who, through no fault of their own, lose bees as a result of the use of approved pesticides near or adjacent to the property where the beehives are located.

In order for a beekeeper to qualify for a payment, in the event he suffers a loss, he is required to notify the ASCS Office in writing, before July 15 each year, of the location of each apiary and the number of colonies and queen nuclei he maintains at each apiary.

**Local task force to begin 'child find'**

Estimates indicate that there may be thousands of children in Kentucky who, for a variety of reasons, are not enrolled in an educational program. To find out how many of these children are in the Nicholas County School District, a local task force plans to begin a "child find".

The task force will be composed of concerned citizens from the community, including representatives from the schools, civic groups, government agencies and church groups, among others.

The purpose of the "child find" is to identify all children who are not receiving an education. Once the children are identified, the school district can plan an educational program.

Initially, the task force will attempt to identify all children who are not in school. An exceptional child has been defined as one who, for one or more reasons, is unable to benefit from the regular school-day routine.

This process will benefit not only the exceptional child, but those children who are out of school for other reasons as well. With this information, the Nicholas County School District will be able to determine the number of exceptional children within the district and plan for their needs, said Betty Conrad, Local Task Force Chairman.

At the same time, it will be able to create a program for or accommodate children who might simply need a modification of their program.

The concept of identifying the number of exceptional children is not a new one. In fact, the school districts are already doing five-year plans of projected needs. However, these plans are based on national incidence figures and do not necessarily reflect the actual situation for Kentucky as a whole or for a particular school district. The "child find" will provide actual figures and identify specific needs for each school district.

The "child find" is a direct result of legislation by the 1974 General Assembly, which charged the State Department of Education with identifying, locating, evaluating and providing for exceptional children. The ultimate goal of the program is to provide appropriate education for all children by 1980.

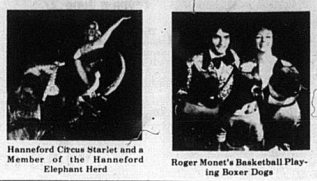
Colonel Griffith is the son of the late Omar Wilson and Susie Sousey Griffith of Ewing.
