## Target prices and loan rates explained

"Target prices are adjusted under an exact formula of law to reflect increased production costs as compared to a base year," Kenneth C. Fryck, head of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS), said. "The loan rates were also increased slightly, reflecting about the same percentage increase that applied to target prices." This way, the concept of the target price law was kept intact.

Target prices are used to determine payments made to producers on participating farms who the higher of the national average market price for the first five months of the marketing year, or the loan rate, is less than the established target price for the particular commodity. Target prices are also used to determine payments for these crops under disaster programs of the Agriculture and Consumer Protection Act.

Loans offered agricultural producers an opportunity to obtain cash and hold their crops for later sale and to even cut marketing.

per pound in 1975. The ASCS chief explained that if prices happen to fall below the target level, the difference would be made up by the Government. "And this is literally average prices paid to farmers during a particular year. We don't foresee this happening, but that is the concept," he said.

for education. The resulting bureaucracy was formidable and supervision from regional offices and Washington, was often galling to local officials.

Revenue Sharing was aimed at enlisting support of local governments by making massive grants to these local units for statutorily designated priority expenditures such as operating expenses, public transportation, health, recreation, libraries, social services for the aged or poor, financial administration and ordinary and necessary capital expenditures. The 1972 Revenue Sharing Program was authorized to accept certification of a unit of local government stating that the federal funds supplied had been used for such priorities. No longer were the local officials subject to supervision and direction.

under farm conditions, so it is wise to buy bulls that have not previously been used for breeding.

The bull may be bred to a few heifers from the beginning of the regular breeding season. If a large proportion of the heifers are back in heat 18 to 21 days after being bred, the bull's fertility should be questioned and further tests should be initiated or a replacement bull obtained. You can't expect any bull to settle heifers that haven't reached puberty. So make sure the heifers are old enough and large enough to be bred.

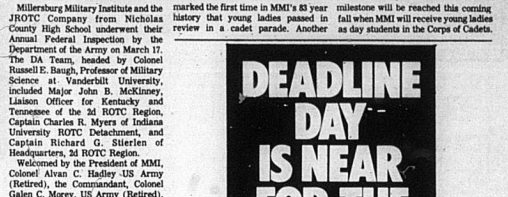

## Annual federal inspection of MMI-NCHS JROTC held



A first at MMI

Millersburg Military Institute and the JROTC Company from Nicholas County High School underwent their Annual Federal Inspection by the Department of the Army on March 17. The DA Team, headed by Colonel Russell E. Baugh, Professor of Military Science at Vanderbilt University, included Major John B. McKinney, Liaison Officer for Kentucky and Tennessee of the 2d JROTC Region, Captain Charles R. Myers of Indiana University ROTC Detachment, and Captain Richard G. Sturten of Headquarters, 2d JROTC Region. Welcomed by the President of MMI, Colonel Alan C. Hadley US Army (Retired), the Commandant, Colonel Galen C. Morey, US Army (Retired), and the Senior Army Instructor, Master Sergeant Bruce Spring, the DA team spent a full day inspecting the Corps of Cadets. They listened to briefings by the Cadet Battalion Staff, observed the ranger team rappel from the roof of the middle school dormitory, inspected barracks, conducted an inspection in ranks in the gymnasium, and reviewed a battalion parade. Cadet Lieutenant Colonel Paul Leibfarth commanded the Corps of Cadets for the day's activities. Joining Colonel Hadley in hosting the DA team were Donald Elder, Superintendent of Schools of Nicholas County and Coble Lee, Principal of Nicholas County High School. This was the first Annual Federal Inspection for the 51 Nicholas County High School students which includes 25 young JROTC Cadets. The Nicholas County contingent, which comprises Company B of the combined Corps of Cadets, is commanded by Cadet 1st Lt. Joseph Kenney.

Final results of the inspection must await completion of the inspection of all the military schools in this JROTC region, but Colonel Baugh commended the Cadets for their performance, unofficially gave the school a qualifying score and passed the JROTC unit in all areas inspected. Wednesday
