Fiscal Court prepares to list new hospital on Nov. ballot

The Nicholas County Fiscal Court met at the courthouse on Wednesday afternoon, March 17 and adopted the following in regard to the hospital construction project:

(1) A certificate of need will be prepared and submitted by May 1 relative to proposed construction of a new county hospital.

(2) The court agreed to commit themselves to a maximum of \$11,800 for architect's fee for preliminary drawings and services and, if needed, for \$1,000 for test borings at the site.

(3) To make a contractual agreement with a bonding agent.

(4) Joseph H. Conley, Nicholas County Attorney, would handle legal aspects not otherwise provided by bonding agents and bonding attorneys.

(5) That all necessary steps be taken to see that the question of a bond issue be put on the November ballot.

The court voted to purchase an oil portrait of the late County Judge, Floyd Clark. The portrait is to be hung in the courtroom of the Nicholas County Courthouse.

The newly appointed Carlisle Planning and Zoning Commission will meet Tuesday, March 20, at 7:30 p.m. at the City Building.
