BOWLING GREEN—America's Next 100 Years is the theme of Western Kentucky University's 1976 Homecoming.

The Homecoming Committee, led by Dr. John D. Minton and Lee Robertson, co-chairmen, has announced a number of activities for this year's celebration which will culminate Saturday, Nov. 6, when Western's Hilltoppers face Middle Tennessee's Blue Raiders in L.T. Smith Stadium at 1 p.m.

Events will have a Bicentennial focus with a new look to the future. Though tradition has it that the game is a major activity of Homecoming, the celebration on campuses everywhere, there will also be something for everyone that week-end in Bowling Green, Western's championship report.

Starting Thursday evening, student groups are inviting a Boyfire and Pop Rally at 6:30 p.m. at the Keen Hall Parking Lot. Joining this year's Homecoming as an appropriate Bicentennial contribution, a campus Heritage Committee will sponsor its annual exhibition and luncheon for area artists, starting Friday's activities Nov. 5.

A reception is open to the public from 2 until 4 p.m. on the Mezzanine of the Dero Downing University Center, featuring a number of workshoppers.

Friday is also Alumni day as those from special groups get together on campus as well as all alumni who wish to come back to the annual Alumni Dinner at 6:30 p.m. in the Ballroom of the Paul L. Garrett Conference Center.

A dance for alumni will follow the dinner at the Bowling Green Country Club. Ticket information for both may be obtained from the Alumni and Placement Office on campus.

A special event Friday evening at 7 p.m. will be a presentation by the Fine Arts Festival of the Atlanta Dance Company in Van Meter Auditorium.

The troupe of six dancers will be performing a two-week residency at the campus where they have participated in an Artists-in-Residence program at Jones-Jagers Laboratory School.

A special event on Saturday is an Open House and Reception at the new Environmental Sciences and Technology Building which opened with the fall semester. The public is invited to view the building.

At 10 a.m. a highlight of Saturday's events will be the annual Homecoming Parade through downtown Bowling Green. This year's will include 15 floats and 11 area bands, led by Western's Marching Band.

Following the Western game Saturday, alumni, students, faculty and friends will be hosted by the University at a Reception in E.A. Diddle Arena.

Millersburg council discusses land

Millersburg City Attorney Jeff Layson told the City Council at their meeting Monday night that another deed had been found on the Millersburg City Fire Department property. The City probably has a claim to the large land, at the site of the present fire house, to build a new fire house large enough to accommodate two fire trucks and a community room if the City chooses to do so. The matter was discussed but no decisions were made.
