Before we get too far into holiday recipes let's try something different. Spaghetti with Shrimp is good, that is if you like shrimp. I don't predict everyone will like everything I do, or even try all the recipes that find their way into this column. However, if you have an adventurous spirit and like to try something new, here is a good place to start.

SPAGHETTI WITH SHRIMP

10 or 12 ounce package cleaned, cooked, frozen shrimp, or use 2-4½ ounce cans of large or medium shrimp
1—8 ounce package spaghetti
2 cloves of garlic
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon oregano
¼ teaspoon basil
¼ stick margarine
3 tablespoons olive oil*
¼ cup coarsely chopped parsley (use fresh)
grated Parmesan cheese
freshly ground pepper

*Do use olive oil, there is definitely a difference in the taste than when using regular salad oil.
Cook spaghetti following package directions. Drain in colander and keep hot.
Heat margarine, olive oil, minced garlic, salt, oregano and basil in large saucepan. Cook about five minutes. Add parsley and dry shrimp. Reheat and thicken slightly with two egg yolks or a lot of corn starch. Add drained shrimp and keep warm. Do not cook
