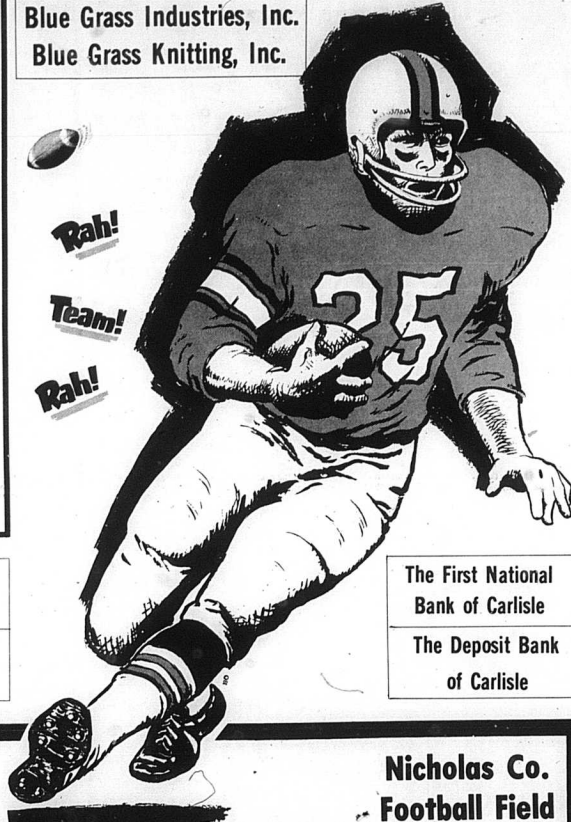

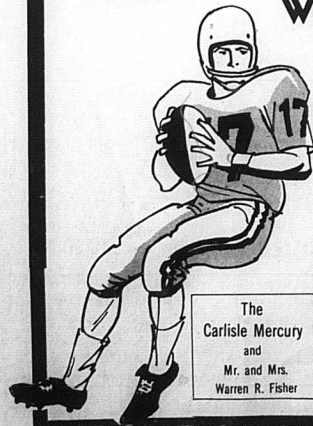

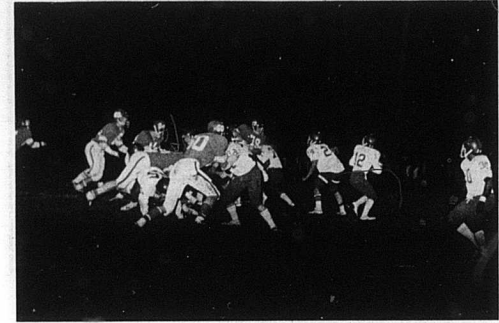

The Nicholas County Bluejackets, 16-14 at the local football field, for a five straight game win and a 7-4 season. Smooth ballhandling and a tough defense, were the key factors in the Bluejackets win against the Lions. Nicholas took over the ball on their own start of the game. Lewis County was penalized one yard on the extra point try for illegal procedure, so Greg Letcher's one yard run for the two point conversion was good, leaving the score 6-0 halfway through the first quarter. Dave Gaunce of Lewis County came back by scoring a 28 yard touchdown. Gaunce's run for the extra point was also good, leaving the score 8-4 at the end of the first quarter. Midway through the second quarter, Nicholas took over the ball on their own 23 yard line. The Jackets moved the ball for four first downs, putting the ball

Best start in ten years backs UK against Georgia

The University of Kentucky Wildcats, off to their best start in 11 years, will meet nationally ranked Georgia at 7:30 p.m. Saturday in Commonwealth Stadium in what shapes up as a key battle in the Southeastern Conference race. The Wildcats upset nationally ranked LSU, 21-7, Saturday night at Commonwealth to run their season record to 4-2 and their conference record to 1-1. Georgia is 2-1 in the conference after a 4-0 victory over Vanderbilt Saturday. Only Florida and Auburn, each 2-0, are undefeated in the league. The last time a UK football team won four of its first six games was in 1966, when Charlie Bradshaw's best team opened with victories over Missouri and Mississippi, lost to Auburn, defeated Florida State, lost to LSU and then won three in a row before losing to Houston and Tennessee for a 6-4 record. The big game for the Wildcats in the LSU game played in the first quarter

after a punting exchange gave LSU possession on their 11. Quarterback Pat intended pass to tailback Charles Alexander and went through on the UK. As Dallas Owens made a one-handed interception and was off the way to score. Rod Stewart later put two more touchdowns on the board for UK, scoring on a 30-yard run in the second quarter and a 16-yard run in the opening minutes of the second half. LSU's lone touchdown came after a pass interference call against the Wildcats gave the Tigers first and 10 on the UK seven. Reserve quarterback Bobby Moreau scored on the next play.
