

Farm and food programs major challenges, Sen. Ford says

According to U.S. Sen. Wendell Ford, one of the major challenges awaiting the 96th Congress will be to determine what legislation should be enacted to replace the farm and food programs that expire at the end of next year.

In a speech to the Kentucky Association of County Agricultural Agents at Cumberland Falls State Park, Ford said he expects the next Congress, in considering a national farm policy, to focus on such subjects as target prices for food and grain crops, a disaster insurance program and increased price supports for dairy products and to

save farmers from over-production and low prices, but under present policies, farmers have been left to carry all the

"The need for a sound food and agricultural policy is greater today than ever before," Ford said. "The demands placed on our food production capacity in recent years are unprecedented, while production and marketing costs have risen drastically."

"We have had neither an adequate, nor stable national farm and food program in the last few years. Growing

world demand for our food has helped

farmers from over-production and low prices, but under present policies, farmers have been left to carry all the

"The reform that occurred was a positive and necessary step toward preservation of family farms and, hopefully, will stop the mass exodus

from the rural areas as well as making farming more attractive to our young people."

The estate tax reform unifies tax rates on estate and gift transfers. The present \$60,000 estate tax exemption is replaced with a \$30,000 credit which gradually increases to \$47,000 by 1981. This is equivalent to a \$175,000 exemption.

The amount a person can leave tax free to a spouse is increased to the greater of \$50,000 or 50 percent of the

value of the estate. A "use" valuation is provided for farms and small businesses so that they will be valued at current rather than potential development. And the period of payments in certain cases was increased from 10 to 15 years.

oral history for the 110 public libraries in Kentucky.

According to Mrs. Seelling, each library receives blank cassette tapes [our library has 200]. Local persons with knowledge of their city and county history will be interviewed by volunteer representatives of clubs, organizations and churches; these interviews will be recorded on the tapes and cataloged in the libraries. A representative from the State Department of Library and Archives will be setting up a meeting at the library within the next two months with Mrs. Seelling and volunteer interviewers whom Mrs. Seelling will be contacting, to organize the project for the Nicholas County Library.

The basement of the library building houses the office of Buffalo Trace Regional Library with Mrs. Mary Catherine Dawkins, regional librarian, assisted by Mrs. Merolyn Sams and Mrs. Lucille Neal, library assistants. The basement is also used by many civic groups and businesses for meetings during and after library hours. Among the groups utilizing the basement are the two local women's clubs, Chamber of Commerce, Little League, Garden Club, Girl Scouts, 4-H club, Eastern Kentucky P.C.A. and I.G.A. Story Hour sessions conducted during the summer months for children are also held in the basement. It is requested that use of the conference room and basement be made well in advance.
