

District hopes alive after 14-0 Raceland upset

Nicholas County defeated Raceland, 14-0, Friday night here at the local football field, increasing the Jackets' chances of a three-way tie for first place in the district.
Nicholas County is 2-1 in the district now, and if the Jackets beat MMI this Friday night, they will be 3-1 in the district. Fairview is 3-1 now, having completed its district play. And, if Raceland beats Mayville Friday night, they'll be 3-1. This will be the three teams in the first-place spot.

The Bluejackets were featured in the Lexington Herald on Wednesday, Oct. 28, in an article entitled "Nicholas Surprises—Defense key to 1-2 Jacket record," by Mike Johnson. Anyone who missed reading it may do so during the next several weeks at the Nicholas County Library.

Both Raceland and Nicholas County played tough defense in the first half and the score was 0-0 at halftime. Raceland was forced to punt deep in their own territory midway through the third quarter, but the ball was centered over the punter's head and downed by Nicholas County on the Raceland two yard line. Joe Russell gained one yard. Mark Russell's second down pass attempt fell incomplete. On third down, Nicholas County tried a fake field goal run for no gain, but Raceland was penalized half the distance to the goal for officials. On the next play, Damon Booth plunged in for the score. The two point conversion attempt was unsuccessful, making the score 6-0 in favor of Nicholas County.
Timmy Ockerman recovered a fumble on Nicholas County's 38 yard line, as the clock ran out to end the third quarter. A completed 27 yard pass from Joe Russell, who was playing for the

first time since his jaw was broken in the Bellevue game, to Timmy Ockerman, gave the Jackets a first down. Booth carried the ball for no gain, followed by Clifford Thompson for six yards. Joe Russell led for two carries. A flag on the fourth down play set Raceland back five yards, and gave the Jackets a first down, on the Ram's four yard line. Clifford Thompson ran the ball in for the score. Damon Booth's run for the two point conversion was good, making the score 14-0, which ended the scoring for the game.

The Bluejacket defense was again outstanding. Anthony Williams led the defense with 10 tackles. Greg Letcher and Cliff Shanmatt were close behind with nine each, followed by R.T.

Mansey with eight, Damon Booth with seven, Dr. Gene Williams with six, Timmy Ockerman with five, and Mark Mattias, Jimmy Smith, and Clifford Thompson with two each.
Damon Booth had 34 yards on 12 carries to lead Nicholas County's offense, followed by Clifford Thompson with 32 yards on nine carries, Joe Russell with 27 yards on nine carries, and Greg Letcher with 11 yards on three carries.
The Bluejackets completed three out of eight passes for 60 yards.
Nicholas County punted twice for 72 yards.
Nicholas plays MMI here Friday night at 8 p.m. in its last district game.
