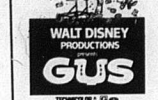

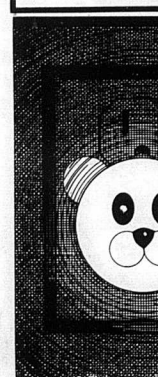

Farm and Home

County extension agents... and enjoy life and, according to University of Kentucky Horticulturists, orchardists and other specialists in the art of rural living, to renovate the lawn, for the last time in the year, plant daffodil bulbs, bring in house plants, transplant evergreen shrubbery, sow cover crops on vacant garden spots, water plants under eaves where they do not normally enough water, and gather materials for fall flower arrangements—milkweeds, fennels, bitersweet, yucca, hydrangea, okra, leafed and others.

Early fall is the best time to renovate a lawn. If less than 50 per cent of desirable grasses constitute the lawn, it is usually best to get rid of all the grass and prepare a new seedbed to plant new grasses. The variety of grass is best determined by the lawn environment according to amount of exposure to sunlight. Open areas should be seeded with a 3 to 1 mixture of bluegrass to red fescue. In shady areas this mixture should be changed to 3 to 1 red fescue and bluegrass respectively.

Presley Kendall shoots on international teams

During August and September, Major Pres Kendall participated as a member of three U.S. international teams. Competing on the U.S. Denver team with 22 target rifles, at Camp Perry, Ohio, for the 10th year, Kendall was one of the top 20 shooters thereby earning team membership.

As one of the last events of the Bicentennial celebration the British sent a high power rifle team to Fresno, Calif. to shoot against a select U.S. team. Shooting at 200, 300, 600 and 800 yards, the U.S. team won by over 140 points. Kendall was high scorer for the U.S.

Based on his performance at the 1976 National Championship at Camp Perry, he has been notified by the National Rifle Association that he has been again, selected to shoot on an international team at the British National Championships at Brixley, England in August, 1977.
