Since the peach and pickling season will soon be over, I'll give you these recipes for strawberries but also equally good with fresh peaches.

- ENGLISH SHORTBREAD**
 - 2 cups butter, softened
 - 2 cups powdered sugar, (heaping 1 1/2)
 - 1 tablespoon cornstarch
 - 1 1/2 sticks butter or margarine
 - Sift dry ingredients into bowl and mix in the butter with your fingers until it is like coarse cornmeal. Smooth out on greased baking sheet until about 1/4-inch thick. Straighten edges by gently pressing with a spatula, smoothing top with open hand. Prick all over with fork. Bake at 250 degrees or 275 degrees about 30 minutes.
 - Cut into squares while still hot. Allow to cool before removing from baking sheet with spatula.
- PICKLED PEACHES**
 - Remove skins from 1 quart peaches.

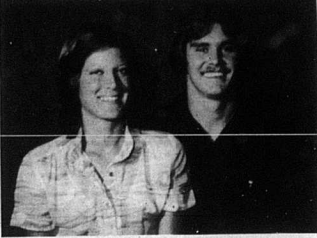

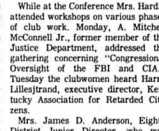
