

### Two District Judges elected; others file for local offices

As the March 30 filing deadline arrived last Wednesday, two district judges were, in essence, elected in this district because they are unopposed in the May 24 Primary.

In the 1st Division also District 18, G.A. Farnalora of Mt. Olivet will serve as judge. Both of those men will represent Robertson, Harrison, Nicholas and Pendleton counties which comprise the new judicial District 18 which replaces all local county and city courts.

Also unopposed locally are incumbent Rep. Adrian Arnold, 7th State Legislative District, and Joseph H. Conley, Nicholas County Attorney.

There are 26 magisterial candidates, two of whom are Republicans. No Republicans filed for any other office in Nicholas county.

Democrats who have filed for county offices other than the magistracy, have filed an affidavit for county judge executive, county clerk, jailer, sheriff, PVA, and coroner. All of these candidates have opposition. Most will be listed on the classified page of The Mercury until the May 24 Primary, but because there are so many candidates we will not try to list them here, but refer you to page 11.

Three Democrats have filed as Democratic candidates for State Senator in the 30th District to replace Tom Ward. A fourth, Wilbur Schen of Versailles, who announced recently did not file before the deadline. He will, therefore, not be a candidate for this office.

**'Miracle for Kevin' explained, film story entered for Emmy**  
"Miracle for Kevin" story and film which won the 1977 National Press Photographers Association (NPPA) three-minute film award for John (Tony) Elder occurred July 25, 1976. Kevin Hettler, 11, his father and uncle were riding in a cabin cruiser when the boat struck a log in the Ohio River and overturned. The father and uncle were the own crew of the boat, but they could not find the boy. A passing fish boat fished them out of the water and towed them to shore. The boy, Mike Frank's dog, Kevin was nowhere to be found.

Some 40 minutes later, rescuers at the dock decided to retrieve the boat and search inside, where some five minutes later they found Kevin in a semi-conscious condition. He was given mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. He had been trapped some 40 minutes in an air pocket under the overturned boat.

His life was saved by the first Cincinnati TV cameraman to ever win the prize since it began in 1967. Two years ago, Bob Phillips of Channel 2, Dayton, Ohio, won it for coverage of a fire shooting.

The three-minute film story was in competition with network and major station members of NPPA. Elder now plans to submit it for regional Emmy consideration. Associated Press competition and the Columbia University-DuPont awards.

He served as TV 12's assignment editor for five months until mid-January when he returned to the photography staff. He will be in charge of the station's new electronic equipment, the Electronic Data Gathering Equipment, when it gets its live capability.
