## 'Time to Run' to be shown

The Billy Graham film, "Time to Run", will be shown at the First Baptist Church on Sunday, April 17, at 7 p.m. The film's theme is the difficulty with which a young man faces the problem of adjusting to his father's standards and his own standards.

The film was filmed on location in Southern California and stars Ed Nelson, Randall Carver, Barbara Rigel, Joan Whinnell and Gordon Rigby. It is of special interest to parents with teenagers who may be unknowingly living in a two-standard world. They have one standard theoretically, but practically, they live by another standard.

The film was chosen to be shown at this particular time because of an understanding of supposed and real problems which the young people of Nicholas county and Carlisle are facing, according to Rev. H. Dallas Sage.

## Burgers airlifted

Attacking the food shortage in flooded counties the Kentucky Army National Guard airlifts hamburgers from Winchester to Eastern Kentucky. The "Big Mac Attack" was launched when Jerry Healy, who owns three McDonald's restaurants, donated the burgers. About 3,000 of them have been flown to stranded residents of Pikeville, Harlan and two counties of Pikeville. The flight crew consisted of two corporate jet helicopters to fly more food to the devastated areas recently.

The First Baptist Church feels that they have a responsibility for helping these young people find something to do with their time. Rev. Sage stated, "Therefore, the film is being shown, and all Junior High (7th and 8th grades) and High School students are invited. After the film, refreshments will be served in the Fellowship Hall. The youth may stay and talk as long as they like. There will be an offering taken during the film, but no charge is being made. Cardinal Hill Hospital, an Easter Seal center at Lexington provided care and treatment for 74 children and adults in 1976.
