**DORSEY WATKINS**  
Dorsey Watkins, 72, died Friday, April 8, 1977 at his home on the Lower Jackson Road after an illness several months.

He was a native of Nicholas county, son of the late John and Stella Johnson Watkins and a member of the East Union Christian Church. He was a laidwinder, a member of the Kentucky Wildlife Federation, the Kentucky Historical Society, charter member and past president of the Nicholas County Fish and Game Club. He was President of the Year in the Eighth Wildlife District in 1962, former member of the Carlisle Rotary Club, a Kentucky Colonel, and was a member of the committee instrumental in the development of Lake Carmico and was director of the Lake Development Association.

## FORD SAYS UTILITY SALES TAX MUST GO

If Ed Ford has his way, people in Kentucky won't be paying the five percent sales tax on their residential electric, gas, water and telephone bills. The Opihiana veterinarian who is a candidate for the 30th District State Senatorial nomination said that if elected, his "first priority" would be to introduce and fight for removal of the levy.

In a statement released to The Carlisle Mercury, Dr. Ford called the utility sales tax "a nuisance that will get worse as months pass, unless we do away with it."

He cited three reasons why such a plan has merit:

1. Utilities are a necessity just like food and medicine. The sales tax on these items has already been removed and the benefits to both citizens and state are obvious.
2. The energy shortage will force a steady increase in utility costs. This will create a larger tax payment for consumers. It will be especially hard on the low and middle income families plus those on fixed incomes, such as senior citizens.
3. Removal can be achieved without any adverse effect on essential state programs. In fact, the money consumers save will be put back into circulation, voluntarily, and therefore will promote additional jobs and strong sales in the marketplace.

Ford said he would fully outline his program after putting finishing touches on the proposed legislation.

"I want it to be ready before the Legislature begins because I am convinced that the people need and deserve this consideration at the earliest possible date," the 31-year-old Democrat stressed.

Ford is in a three-way race for the State Senate seat. He is making his first bid for state office.

"I believe we can generate the kind of support that will be necessary to pass this tax relief plan, but of course it will take the enthusiasm of Kentuckians to get their wishes known," he said, "removing the tax from residential bills is all positive, and I think we can include that portion paid by schools and non-profit medical facilities."
