Everything in its season over dandelions. This week through the following letter and timely recipe. I don't know about you but we've got dandelions practically coming out of our ears. I thought there ought to be some way of using them and I finally found it. One lady brought me a couple look and I have a dandelion wine recipe. I hope you can use it in your column.

DANDELION WINE
1 gal. boiling water over 3 qt. dandelion blooms
LIFT STAND OVERNIGHT, STRAIN INTO LQUID
juice of 1 orange
2 lbs. granulated sugar
BOIL FOR 30 MINUTES. COOL
SPREAD
1 slice of toast with 1/2 cake yeast
ADD TO LIQUID. Let stand for 4 weeks or until fermentation ceases. Bottle and cork well.

According to the book this is an old time favorite from Alberta and Newfoundland.

Rhubarb is seasonal right now. At least our mature plants are ready to use.

RHUBARB SALAD
Wash and cut off leaves and stems ends of rhubarb. If tender do not peel. Cut into 1/2 inch pieces. Add 1/2 cup of rhubarb, add 2 cups of sugar. Cook in syrup with just enough water to keep it from burning, cook until tender. To conserve on sugar, you can pour stand 15 minutes, drain, and use only 1/4 cup sugar.

Since we have been talking about cooking meals in the oven, you can even cook rhubarb. Place in baking dish. Cover. It takes 100 degrees over 40 minutes. Add sugar and any sweetening to taste. Remember, always add artificial sweetener, always add after fruit is cooked to avoid any bitter taste.

RHUBARB CUSTARD PIE
2 cups sliced rhubarb
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
2 tablespoons flour or cornstarch
2 tablespoons margarine
3 egg whites
1/4 cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 baked pie shell

Cook first 5 ingredients together until thick and rhubarb is tender. Cool, pour into pie shell. Beat egg whites until stiff. Add to custard and beat until peaks form. Add vanilla. Spread over pie and bake until golden brown.

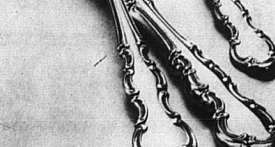
