When we hit August I begin to feel a bit panicky. The summer seems to be flying by and I haven't had time to do things I had planned for those lazy, lazy days of summer. Friends are calling of full plans and of children starting back to school. Whatever happened to my picnics and cook-outs? Well, never too late. Without a lot of work you can look into your refrigerator and I'm sure there is picnic food there.

I have to give the "three baked" credit for in that respect. It is not necessary to stick with the three baked called for in that recipe. A delicious salad can be made from vegetables, most likely in your refrigerator right now. Green beans, corn, potatoes, raw radishes or yellow squash, lima beans, cauliflower, broccoli. The list is almost endless. Simply put the desired vegetables, well drained, in a bowl and pour a bottle of salad dressing over them, or use your own recipe of sugar, vinegar, salt, oil, etc. over the vegetables. Mix well. You might want to add thinly sliced onions, finely chopped celery and sliced cucumbers. Cover bowl tightly and refrigerate several hours to marinate vegetables. Should be ready by picnic time. Then simply toss lightly and serve. To make a more hearty dish you might want to add strips of cheddar cheese at the last minute.
