What would summer be without homemade ice cream? Some to serve heated high in a dish, or in an ice cream cone. This summer I have eaten ice cream in cones, lattes so good, because we had the pleasure of trying it that way to our grandson while he was on his last day. So I decided to continue serving it in the cones. Sometimes they don't taste quite the same without the big blue eyes of a three year old watching to see if we were eating too fast for him.

With so many good commercial ice creams available, ice cream cones are reserved for a special event. However many people still enjoy making their own favorite ice cream, especially in the summer. Each year I read new and different recipes for making frozen desserts and/or ice cream. Here are some recipes for fruit-flavored ice creams that you can make, using your freezer trays.

- PINEAPPLE YOGURT SHERBERT**
 1 1/2 cups can crushed pineapple (this is the small can)
 1 1/2 teaspoons unsifted gelatin
 1/4 cup sugar
 1/2 cup lemon juice
 1 1/2 cups plain yogurt
 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
 1 1/2 cups water
 1 egg white
 Place pineapple in small saucepan
- APPRISALICE ICE CREAM**
 1/4 cup milk
 4 egg yolks or 2 eggs lightly beaten
 1 plus 1/2 cup sugar (sugar depends on taste)
 1 can (6 ounce) frozen orange juice concentrate, drained
 3 teaspoons vanilla
 1/8 teaspoon salt
 1 cup heavy cream
 In top of double boiler combine milk, egg, and 1/2 cup sugar. Cook over hot water, stirring until mixture cooks a metal spoon. Cool. Stir in remaining half the vanilla, salt and remaining sugar, blend well. Pour into ice tray and freeze until ice crystallizes at edges. Whip cream and add remaining vanilla. Fold into orange
