Mrs. O'Bannon's class at NCES conducts consumer education unit

Mrs. Lettie O'Bannon's class at Nicholas County Elementary has been conducting a consumer education unit. The objectives of this unit was to help the children in the class become better and wiser consumers. This was done through filmstrips, field trips, interviews and/or surveys.

There were three major concepts stressed. First was spending money wisely (always know your spending limit), realize you are different from your friends. Second spend money on basic needs (shelter, food, and clothing). The third was understanding truth or false impressions in advertising. The fact was stressed that everyone should beware of some of commercials, commercials on radio, and ads in papers or magazines.

One of the activities was to come up with a new cereal (Wiggles) and to think of ways to get the product to sell. What was done was so real that there were students who wanted to know if there was an actual new cereal called Wiggles on the market now. Surveys, billboard and other advertising means were used.

A supermarket was visited and questions asked about different products. A chart was kept of things the students liked. A chart of things you need (food, shelter, clothing) was made. Also a chart was made on what the students wanted. Products were compared. The final activity was a

The committee's responsibility will also be to decide on exceptional cases as to the readiness of the young couple to enter into a sacramental marriage. Two other priests, a professional counselor and a married lay person are also on the committee.
