**POTATO CANDY**  
1/2 cup mashed potatoes  
1 stick butter or margarine  
3 pound loaves powdered sugar  
Mix all ingredients well. Roll out flat and spread with a thin layer of peanut butter. Roll up and chill in refrigerator. Slice into pieces. (Potatoes should be cooked as usual but no salt added.)

**POTATO PUFF CANDY**  
1/2 cup mashed potatoes  
1/4 cup melted sugar  
1 teaspoon lemon extract  
1 cup cornflakes  
1 cup chopped nuts

**PENOCHE**  
2 cups brown sugar  
2 tablespoons butter  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2 cups chopped nuts  
Boil sugar and milk to soft boil stage. Remove from heat; add butter favoring and nuts. Cool. Beat till creamy and thickened; pour into greased pan and cut into squares.

**GLAZED CHESTNUTS**  
1 cup chestnuts  
1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 cup water  
1/2 cup white corn syrup  
Slice or puncture chestnut shells and boil in water for about 20 minutes. Cool and peel. Mix sugar, water and corn syrup. Cook, stirring to 290 degrees on

**RAISIN BOY BONNS**  
1 cup dark or golden raisins  
2 tablespoons peanut butter  
1 tablespoon honey  
Chopped nuts  
Rinse raisins in hot water and drain on paper towels. Put through food chopper using coarse blade. Blend in peanut butter and honey. Form into

**CHOCOLATE ALMOND BALLS**  
1/2 cup butter, softened  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1/2 cup unsweetened chocolate  
2 teaspoons grated orange rind  
2 cups flour  
1/2 cup finely chopped almonds  
Cream butter with 1/2 of the sugar. Beat in egg, vanilla and salt. Mix 2 oz. of the chocolate. Mix melted chocolate and orange rind into mixture. Stir in flour and 1/2 cup of the almonds. Shape into 1/4 inch balls. Continue remaining 1/2 cup sugar, electric blender. Process until chopped and mixed. Roll balls in this mixture. Bake on ungreased baking sheet at 350 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes. Cool on wire racks. Makes about 1 dozen.

**FLORIDA AMBRONIA**  
3 grapefruit sections  
4 oranges, sectioned  
1 pint strawberries, washed, hulled, and halved  
1/2 cup flaked coconut  
1/2 cup sugar  
Peel and go over fruit carefully to remove all white membrane. Remove seeds from grapefruit to save fruit juice.

Just before serving, layer grapefruit sections, orange sections, and strawberries in bowl; sprinkle each layer with coconut and sugar. Or mix grapefruit and oranges with sugar and just before serving. Serves 8.

### Gov. Carroll's sincerity challenged regarding utility sales tax removal

LEXINGTON — State Senator-elect Larry Hopkins (R-Payette) today challenged the sincerity of Governor Julian Carroll's recent statement that he supports removal of the 5% sales tax from utilities. Last week Mr. Hopkins said he was drafting legislation to take the sales tax off essential utilities. Mr. Hopkins called on the Governor to submit alternative budget proposals to the next General Assembly, one of which would be based on revenue estimates excluding the sales tax on various utilities. Mr. Hopkins made this request in a letter to Gov. Carroll which was in response to a letter Gov. Carroll recently wrote to the Legislative Research Commission suggesting the appointment of a special legislative committee to study what services should be reduced or terminated or develop new sources of revenue to replace that lost by removal of the utility tax.

State Senator-elect Ed Ford (D-Cynthiana) has also pressed a bill to remove utility taxes.
