Generous dash of two hot pepper sauce, depending on taste

12-oz. can beer

Combine all ingredients except beer and beat unscrupulously. Pour in beer slowly, beating constantly, until cheese is very smooth. Store in covered jars in refrigerator. To serve, remove from refrigerator at least 30 to 40 minutes before serving time and beat again quickly.

ANCHOVY PUFFS

Mix 1/4 cup butter and 1 1/2-oz. package cream cheese; add 1 cup flour. Chill. Roll very thin and cut with 2-inch cookie cutter. Spread with anchovy paste; fold over; bake 400 degrees for ten minutes. Serve hot.

HORSERADISH CREAM CHEESE SPREAD

1 3-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened

2 tablespoons onion cream

1 tablespoon finely chopped parsley

Enough grated fresh horseradish for good flavor.

In bowl, beat together cream cheese and onion cream. Stir in parsley and horseradish. You might want to add a bit of salt. If you can't find fresh horseradish use the hottest and best. Prepared you can find. Good served on toasted party finger bread or crackers.
