- Now for some party foods. There is still that week between Christmas and New Year for these specials. Or good for New Year celebrations.
- GREEN SPECIAL:**
1 15-oz. pkg. chopped spinach, cooked and well drained
1 small onion, grated
1 cup mayonnaise
Parley and lemon juice. Salt to taste. Cook and drain spinach well. Add onion, really the amount of onion depends on taste, so use your own judgment. Combine with the mayonnaise. Add lemon juice to taste and top with a generous sprinkling of the parley.
- VEGETABLE CRUNCH**
1/2 pound cottage cheese
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1/4 cup finely diced celery
1/4 onion, chopped
1/4 cup chopped cucumber
2 green onions finely sliced
to teaspoon salt
- HORSERADISH CREAM CHEESE SPREAD**
1 3-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
2 tablespoons sour cream
1 tablespoon finely chopped parley
Enough grated fresh horseradish for good flavor.
- In bowl, beat together cream cheese and sour cream. Stir in parley and horseradish. You might want to add a bit of salt. If you can't find fresh horseradish use the hottest and best, prepared you can find. Good served on toasted party hot bread or crackers.
- SNAPPY DIP**
Dash of Worcestershire sauce
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1 3-oz. can anchovy fillets, drained and chopped
- BEER CHEESE**
1 pound sharp cheddar cheese, grated or finely grained
1/2 pound mild cheddar cheese, ground or
- finely grated
1 clove garlic, minced
2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon dry mustard
Generous dash of two hot pepper sauce, depending on taste
1 1/2-cup can beer
- Combine all ingredients except beer and beat unscrupulously. Pour in beer slowly, beating constantly, until cheese is very smooth. Store in covered jars in refrigerator. To serve, remove from refrigerator at least 30 to 45 minutes before serving time and beat again quickly.
- ANCHOVY PUFFS**
Mix 1/2 cup butter and 1 3-oz. package cream cheese; add 1 cup flour. Chill. Roll very thin and cut with 2-inch cookie cutter. Spread with anchovy paste; fold over; bake 400 degrees for ten minutes. Serve hot.

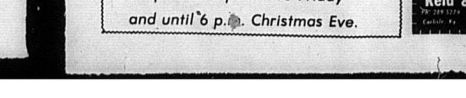
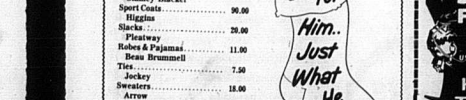
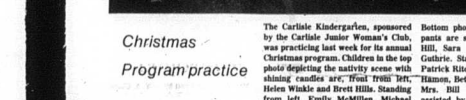

The Nicholas County Sheriff's Department investigated two non-injury auto accidents the past weekend.

Leory Todd, 35, Carlisle was attempting to turn left from the Myers Station Road at the residence of Edward Todd in Myers about 6 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 17. Deputy Sheriff J. W. Ecton said, when an auto operated by Jackie Emmons, 27, Fleming County hit the rear end of the Todd vehicle. Both vehicles were traveling toward Flemingburg at the time of the mishap according to the accident report.

The Emmons auto was a total loss while considerable damage was done to the Todd vehicle, Mr. Ecton surmised. A pickup truck owned by Pecka's Farm Supply and operated by Billy Martin (Route 1, Sharpsburg) went over an embankment and into a fence on the Woody Wilson farm on Somerset Road about 3 p.m. Friday, Dec. 16. Sheriff Heene Smoot said the accident occurred when Martin's truck pulled his auto out of a driveway into the path of the truck, causing Martin to lose control after the vehicles collided. Little damage was done to the vehicles.
