

Set-aside Land Rules Listed

Final rules for the federal farm program which permit some grazing on set-aside acreage and would broaden the erosion prevention measures for set-aside land, according to Eugene Letcher, Chairman of the Nicholas County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) committee.

The Department of Agriculture is willing for a 30 per cent reduction in wheat acreage and a 10 per cent conditional set-aside for feed grains.

The university, founded in 1807 and located on the 14,000 acre domain in Lawrenceburg, Tenn., is governed by a Board of Trustees, elected by 24 voting members of the Episcopal Church in the southeast. It is composed of three colleges: a school of Theology, a preparatory school, the Sewanee Academy of Arts and Sciences, with an enrollment of 1,900 students.

Mr. Stamier, a 1962 graduate of the University, is the owner of the W. H. Stamier Corp. in Millersburg. He and
