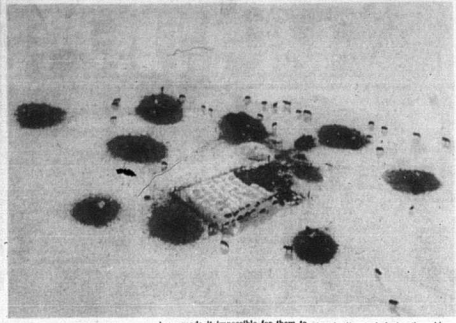
**MRS. TAYLOR RING**
