Production control and price supports were instituted 34 years ago for burley tobacco. The program is now a way of life for growers of this county, and throughout the eight-state burley belt.

Whether or not you are a burley grower, as a resident of a burley county you are linked with the tobacco economy, and the welfare of the area and its burley producing farmers.

The Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association is the growers' own organization. Its main job is to administer the price-support program for burley tobacco. "Yes" means unlimited production and no price supports for the next three years.

Energy conservation means... saving energy in the home

The American homeowner has the double opportunity of making a significant contribution to saving the nation's dwindling energy resources and, at the same time, saving his own money. The opportunity for energy conservation in the residential sector can be seen in the fact that the 73 million residences consumed about one-fifth of all the energy used in the United States.

Several conservation measures applied to space-heating and water-heating—the two major residential end uses of energy—can save up to 12 percent of energy needed for space heating.

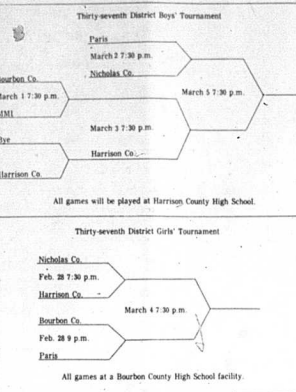


Get off my back! Nicholas County's Dwayne Williams drives over the top of an MMI defender during last week's game with the Cadets.

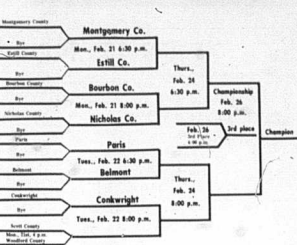
