exemption for residential property owned and occupied by persons 65 or older is now \$5,000. Those eligible, which includes persons who become 65 anytime during 1977, must file an application with the property valuation administrator by March 1.

"I also want to remind farmers of the farmland amendment," he added. "This law permits the valuation of land at its agricultural or horticultural value rather than fair market value and can mean a substantial tax savings to those who own eligible property." Details and application forms are available from the county property valuation administrator. Applications must be made before April 1.

Huddleston chairs
WASHINGTON—Senator Walter (Doc) Huddleston has been designated chairman of the legislative appropriations subcommittee of the Senate Appropriations Committee.

The designation is subject to approval by the Appropriations Committee, which is routine, and a possible reorganization of Senate committees and sub-committees, which should be determined by the end of the month.

The sub-committee Huddleston will head handles appropriations bills for all Senate Committees and various Congressional and Capitol offices, including the Secretary of the Senate, the Sergeant at Arms and the Architect of the Capitol.
