# County road aid totals \$72,894

FITZKENTON—State Transportation Secretary Calvin G. Grayson has announced that Nicholas county will receive \$72,894 in county road aid money during the coming fiscal year, beginning next July 1.

Grayson said that the money will be spent for maintenance along some 131 miles of Nicholas county roads. The approved mileage includes 14 miles of backstop and seven miles of gravel roads.
