Pres Kendall sets shooting record

Pres Kendall, one of the world's foremost shooting authorities, set a new national shooting record at Atlanta, Ga. over the fourth of July weekend. Using a German 22 caliber target rifle of special construction he set a new record of all center shots, the center of the bullseye, at 50 and 100 yards in the Dewar match with a perfect 400 out of 400 points with 40 perfect center shots. He went on to shoot 19 more center shots for a total of 59, bettering the old record by 10.

This match was a part of the southern U.S. regional championship which Kendall won by beating competitors for all sections of the U.S., both civilian and military.

Kendall will go to England in August to represent the U.S. on an international team. The U.S. 10-man team hopes to win the matches at the British National Championship at Bisley.
