However, measles vaccination is strongly encouraged. Initially, all children should receive measles rubella at 15 months of age. Children should be re-vaccinated if they are under 12 years of age and had received vaccine prior to 1975. The need to vaccinate those over 12 years is doubtful.

**Fire chief reports two auto fires**  
Woody Wilson, Nicholas County Fire Chief, said his department answered a call last Tuesday afternoon where they extinguished a fire in a 1971 automobile. Wilson reported the car, which belonged to Bud Cain, had been driven into a hayfield belonging to Herbert McClanahan about a mile from Myers Station on Cassidy Creek Road after it caught fire. The auto was a total loss according to the fire chief.  
On Wednesday evening, May 18, Wilson said the county fire department was called to the Mt. Zion Road where they put out a fire in a car which was the property of Bernice Perkins. The 1969 auto, valued at approximately \$795, was a total loss according to the fire chief. Wilson said Perkins told him the cause of the fire was bad wiring.

**Hospital's insurance decreases noted**  
FRANKFORT—One month after approving an overall 11.8 per cent decrease in physicians' and surgeons' medical malpractice insurance rates by the St. Paul Fire and Marine Insurance Co., the Kentucky Department of Insurance has approved a 23.5 to 41 per cent decrease by the same carrier for hospital professional liability rates.  
The hospital rates, to become effective June 1, are based on both statewide and nationwide loss experience. The doctor's reduced rates became effective with policies written after May 1.  
McGuffey said that any hospital becoming insured by St. Paul for the first time will be charged \$10 per bed under the new rates instead of the 20 cent \$20 fee. The revised rates are based on pure claims made experience (loss experience) instead of occurrence experience as used by the Insurance Services Organization, an insurance rating firm.  
St. Paul underwrites 20-25 per cent of Kentucky's insured hospitals and 10 per cent of the state's doctors.  
McGuffey said the new rates will save hospitals in Kentucky "thousands of dollars."
