Nicholas countians more dependent on industry and business than agriculture to maintain standard of living

A quick glance at the pie graph below, will instantly show you that Nicholas County's agricultural interests aren't responsible for nearly as large a percentage of the county's income as it used to be.

Immediately one might think, "Does this mean that agriculture is on the decline in Nicholas County?" No. In fact, the agricultural income in the county has been rapidly increasing right along with everything else in the

other areas, while at the same time they are still contributing to the agricultural end of things.

This type of working-family when added to the expansion of the county's industry and general inflationary trends have pushed the average per family income in Nicholas County from \$3,871 in 1973, to \$11,234 in 1976.

Monte Carroll, County Agent, said that he believes that the reason for the decline paid to the farmer does not lie in the direct proportion to the costs of producing a crop.

Whatever the reason, causes of increasing, one thing is evident, the numbers of Nicholas Countians who derive their living totally from farming is on the decline and are becoming more and more dependent on our industry and business enterprises to thus increasing the overall income of

the county's agricultural production was \$2 million in 1973, and you have some interesting numbers and the same question that you've had since you first looked at the geometrical rendering accompanying this story: "What does all of this mean?"

Dr. Steve Allen of the University of Kentucky's College of Agriculture says that this drop in percentage is a direct result of the rising industrialization in the general area. There is no drop in the agricultural production, just the people that are involved exclusively with it.

Many small farm families are migrating in other areas that farming is declining and business enterprises to thus increasing the overall income of

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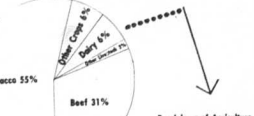
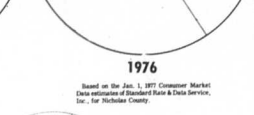
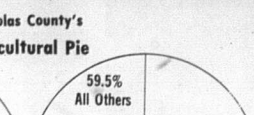
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Nicholas County's Agricultural Pie

Ohio man hospitalized after automobile accident

Robert Kennedy, Manchester, Ohio, was admitted to the Nicholas County Hospital early Monday morning, Nicholas County Sheriff Hesse Sinnot said, for treatment of injuries he received when he lost control of the pickup truck he was driving and left Route 68 ending up in a creek.

Sinnot said the truck was heavily damaged in the mishap which occurred as Kennedy was traveling west on 68 near the residence of Mike Jones.

The Sheriff's department investigated a non-injury auto accident about 3 p.m. Friday, June 3. According to Sheriff Sinnot, Jose Carroll of Route 3 lost control of his auto, as he was traveling on Route 38 near the Nicholas County Hospital, left the roadway and hit some guard rail posts.

On Monday, May 30, Sinnot said, Mary Sargent of Route 1 lost control of her auto as she was traveling east on Pleasant Springs Road. Sinnot reported the auto left the road and ran into a fence on the farm of G.W. Sexton. No injuries were reported.

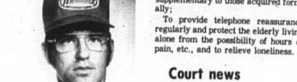
