I did promise more quick and easy desserts to serve during the summer months. Most of the ones this week you can prepare ahead of time while still cool. Of course fresh summer fruits and berries are best, to simply serve with sugar and cream. A light cookie goes well with fruit. By light, I mean a Sugar Cookie or Butter Cookie, not one too rich with nuts, coconut or chocolate.

PLAIN COOKIES

1 cup sugar
1 cup margarine
1 egg
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon butter/milk
Cream 4 cups plain flour
About 1/2 cup water, light and fluffy. Add eggs and vanilla, beat until smooth. Dissolve soda in butter/milk and add to batter mixture. Mix in 2 cups of the flour with mixer, then stir in enough of the rest of the flour to make dough easy to handle. Roll out and cut into desired shape. (Roll dough about 1/8 inch thick.) Bake in 350 degree oven for about 12 to 15 minutes. Remove cookie from pan to cake rack to cool.

Now for a good make ahead dessert.

APRICOT BAVARIAN
1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
2 tablespoons unflavored gelatin
1/2 cup apricot nectar
3 cups apricot nectar
6 tablespoons lemon juice
1 egg white, unbeaten
1 cup cream, whipped
Blend together sugar, gelatin and salt. Add apricot nectar. Cook on medium heat until gelatin is dissolved. Remove from heat and pour into measuring bowl. Cool to room temperature. Add lemon juice and stir in egg white. Place in refrigerator until slightly thickened. Whip with mixer until fluffy and add peak form. Fold in whipped cream. Chill until firm. Serve in fruited sherbet glasses. Garnish with chopped nuts or drained cherries.

EASY CREAMY CHOCOLATE PIE
Preheat oven to 475 degrees. In a 9 inch pie pan, add 1/2 cup of the flour with mixer, then stir in enough of the rest of the flour to make dough easy to handle. Roll out and cut into desired shape. (Roll dough about 1/8 inch thick.) Bake in 350 degree oven for about 12 to 15 minutes. Remove cookie from pan to cake rack to cool.
