



FMRECC annual meeting July 19

The 39th annual meeting of Fleming Mason Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation will be held Tuesday, July 19, under the big tent on the Co-op grounds at Flemingburg.

Huston Delaney, manager of the 12,847 member Cooperative, stated that the registration would begin at 1 p.m. and that the meeting would begin at 2 p.m.

The theme of this year's meeting will be "Our Income, Food and Way of Life Depend on Energy."

The meeting will include the selection of two directors; reports by the manager, president and secretary and legal reports. Nominations for re-election as directors will be H.T. Meyer is now serving as president of the Cooperative and Ginn is serving on the Board of Directors of East Kentucky Power Cooperative.
