

Nicholas county native chooses interesting fiber art vocation

Mrs. Judy Bullington is pictured at the hand-made loom which she ordered from Colorado. She is working on a tapestry which will become a wall hanging when finished. For this tapestry, she drew a general sketch of the design, transferred it to graph paper, then drew a "cartoon" to scale on paper which is kept on the loom as she

weaves. The threads for the tapestry are packed down so closely on the frame that the "warps" cannot be seen.

Mrs. Bullington, the "warp" consists of the threads running lengthwise on the loom, and through which the filling threads are passed to form the cloth.

Fiber creations were initially used to increase one's physical comfort. The Americans Indians, for example, hung woven materials on their walls, and over doors and windows to keep the cold out.

Commissioners for fiber art works come mainly from architects, designers, galleries and individual patrons. Mrs. Bullington continued to use synthetic materials woven on a frame as a new fiber art form.

What is tapestry weaving, we asked, a layman will. It is a fiber art, we were told. One weaves on a hand-made loom following a pre-determined design. Fiber art is versatile and can provide the color, texture or pattern to lives or tone down a building or a room. Fiber arts also include "batik" which is a resist technique. Melen was used to resist the dye used to color the material. Mrs. Bullington does not use this technique, however.

Another unique project Mrs. Bullington has undertaken is that of making and binding books. The pages for the book are folded and cut, then hand sewn onto cloth tapes, and bound in a "case" binding. The binding is covered with paper which is hand decorated. Marking is a process where inks are floated on top of a glutinous solution of sea moss) is most often used.
