Phone bills provide more info

The next telephone bill you get will have a new look, a new size and more information on long distance calls, according to C.A. Harris, local South Central Bell manager.
The new telephone bill was designed to give telephone users more information about their service, Harris expects people in Nicholas county will like the new, simplified format.
"Many customers have said they want more information about their long distance calls, so the new bill provides details about each call," he said.
In addition to information previously provided on long distance calls, the time each long distance call was placed and the duration of the call will appear on the bill.
Harris said the new bill will make it easier to understand other service charges, too.
When charges or credits are due for changes in telephone service, a complete description will be listed on a separate sheet with the bill, Harris said.
"There are other important customer benefits to the new bill, too," Harris said.
"It is more readable, and the bill's smaller size will help the telephone company save money on paper.
"We're always looking for ways to cut costs and hold down the price of telephone service," Harris said.
"We're pleased that we've been able to do that and give customers more information about their telephone service at the same time."

PCB's Potential Trouble for Dairymen
It has been brought to my attention that polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB) may become an important economic factor to dairymen should the Kentucky Department of Health follow the precedent set by departments in our neighboring states of Ohio and Indiana. In those states, tolerance levels were set low enough that many dairymen were dropped from the market, suffering severe economic loss.

The dairy department at UK has asked the help of county agents across the state to aid in the location of dairy farmers, to help me in the location of such sales in Nicholas county. If you have a sale that is suspect, please notify me at the Extension Office, and I will advise you what to do to help avoid milk marketing problems in the future. It could mean the difference between profit and failure.

A research scientist in the USDA has offered to test screenings from the walls of silos suspected to have PCB contamination. In order to protect the identity of the individual farmer, the samples will be sent by number from our office, so only you and myself will know the source of the sample.

This procedure could avoid a possible serious problem in the future. If you wish to cooperate in this program, please let me know as soon as possible.

Word About Pesticide Training

To date, approximately 200 Nicholas farmers have received their pesticide training. I am sure many more need to receive this training, and you are one of those. I am sure you are wondering how you will get it now that all of the meetings have been held. To answer that question, the procedure will be that the Extension Office at 289-2215. Your name will be placed on a waiting list until a sufficient number of people are available to hold another meeting. So don't hesitate. Call in and place your name on the list.

Pepper Meeting Well Attended

A total of 115 pepper growers came on March 17 to learn better how to grow their pepper crops. Hubert Davis, and manager for Moody Dunbar, presented the program and had several timely tips for better production and profit. Since the meeting coincided with the televised UK vs VMI basketball game, there may be some of you who did not come who are interested in growing this profitable crop. If so, it is not too late to come in to the extension office to sign for the acreage you wish to grow.

Kentucky Central Bull Sale—Paris
The sale of bulls tested at the 1976-77 Kentucky Central Bull Testing Station will be held April 11 at the Paris Stockyards in Paris. Sale time is 12 noon EST.
Fifty-three bulls are eligible to sell. Included in this number are 11 Angus, 9 Charolais, 1 Chianina, 24 Polled Herefords, 2 Red Pod, 1 Santa Gertrudis and 5 Short Horned Bulls.
The central bull testing procedures afford bull buyers the best opportunity to fairly compare bulls based on their sire's performance because all bulls are tested alike while they are at the testing station.
