Tobacco trade nets \$1 billion

During 1976, the United States exported nearly \$1.5 billion worth of tobacco and products, imported almost \$360 million worth, and netted over \$1 billion in trade surplus from tobacco. The nation led the world in tobacco exports and came in third as a tobacco importer. U.S. tobacco exports generally account for about one-quarter of all tobacco in world trade.

U.S. Tobacco exports have expanded from 30 percent of the crop in the early 1960's to about 35 percent in recent years.

Leaf tobacco exports totaled 634 million pounds, worth \$921 million. Tobacco products made up \$206 million worth of exports. Last year, fine-cured tobacco, the main cigarette ingredient, accounted for 70 percent of leaf export volume. Burley tobacco, another cigarette ingredient also used in pipe and chewing tobacco, accounted for 15 percent.

road and bridge improvements for the Bluegrass area of Kentucky.

The contracts were awarded following a bid-letting held here by the state's Bureau of Highways on April 21.

In Nicholas county, \$47,300 for deck-jacking repairs to two bridges on Moorefield-Union-KY 13 Road (KY 37) and on Carlisle-Flemingburg Road (KY 31). The bridge on KY 37 crosses Somerset Creek, about 3.7 miles southwest of KY 38 at Morefield. The KY 31 bridge is located over the L & N Railroad and Scrub Grass Creek, 4.9 miles from Carlisle.

Contractor for this project will be All-Points Construction Co. of Lexington.
