

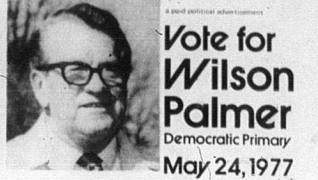

Phil Guimond, seventh grade student in Hilltop Junior High of the Millers Creek West Unity School District, took "champion" honors Saturday in the 18-county Journal-Gazette spelling bee. The 13-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Guimond, 208 Taylor Drive, West Unity, Ind., gave correct spelling to the words "massai" and "galison" to win the contest held in Sneider High School, Fort Wayne, Ind.

Phil advanced to the area competition where he topped 23 other contestants April 13 in the Williams County spelling event.

After 21 rounds of spelling Saturday, only the West Unity student and Larry Morrill, eighth grader from Macconaquah Middle School in Miami County, Ind., remained from the group of 19 to vie for top honor. The two spelled the next six words without hesitation until Phil downed his opponent on the word "Vassini," which Larry spelled "Viasell," and went on to correctly spell "galison."

His award is a trip for himself and one of his parents June 8-9 to Washington, D.C., for the national finals of the spelling bee. Also he won a 20-volume set of the 13th edition of Encyclopaedia Britannica, a leather covered travel clock for his teacher, and a plaque for his school.

Guimond is the grandson of Mrs. John R. Chamblor of Nicholas county.

TO THE VOTERS OF CARLISLE AND NICHOLAS COUNTY

Please consider the many improvements that I have helped accomplish along with the help of many fine city councilmen over the past 24 years as mayor and then give me a chance to be your judge and work for a better county.

1. In 1954 we installed a water line to Licking River. At that time our lakes were almost dry. Now we have plenty of water serving you and the county farmers, some days farmers hauling up to 60 loads a day. We have updated our whole water system, adding new tanks and new lines and making better water service to our industries.
2. We have completed a sewer system, very much needed, making a more healthy community for all of us.
3. Just a few years back we let the county water lines hook on to our system making water available to many of you people in the county.
4. Being the smallest county in the Blue Grass Area Development, I felt that I should attend all the meetings as a member of the board and I have made many fine friends who are always willing to help me because they felt I showed an interest in my county and city. In working with the Executive Director I was able to get our revenue sharing money raised from around \$10,000 to almost \$28,000.
5. In the last few years we have black topped about every street in our city, we have cleaned our creek, helped to prevent flooded areas, and have worked to help keep our city clean.
6. I have invested city money from Bond Sales for a period of 1 to 2 months while waiting to pay contractors and through this means I got enough interest to buy the city two police cruisers. This saved us taking money from the city operating account.
7. I am now working on the Henryville project which will mean so much to my friends in that area and it will be made a part of the city soon with all city benefits.
8. Due to the bad winter, the gas situation hurt all of us, but is O.K. now and no penalty was passed on to any of you. I have been accused of cutting the gas off at Blue Grass Industries and causing you to be out of work. Nobody wanted anyone to be out of work. But, I had orders from our gas suppliers to ask Council to do this. All rulings are made by Council. I vote only in case of a tie. We did what we had to do.

These are just a few of the things I have helped complete during my 24 years as Mayor and I feel that I have had a lot of experience in several different fields.

I feel I can represent my county anywhere, whether it be here, at a Blue Grass Area meeting, in Frankfurt or in Washington. I am not afraid to speak my part and I feel I know the proper people to help me.

I have been asked about county zoning and I am not in favor of any type of county zoning. We do not need it in our county.

I can work with any of the people who are running for county offices and I will not be influenced by any outsiders but will use my own judgement along with the magistrates in helping to get the job done well.

I am a veteran, being a member of the 91st Infantry division, serving in Italy during World War II.

Give me the opportunity to show you, by casting your vote for me.
