

C of C files workmen's comp appeal

FRANKFORT—In a move to block an 18.9 percent average increase that Kentucky lawmakers would have to pay for workmen's compensation coverage, the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce has filed an appeal with the Kentucky Insurance Regulatory Board, the group that pushes the increase into effect Oct. 14.

The request for the increase was asked for by the National Council on Workmen's Compensation, a New York City organization that represents the insurance industry. They filed for an increase that averaged 20 percent, claiming it was needed to offset the Kentucky Chamber's industry's annual losses in Kentucky.

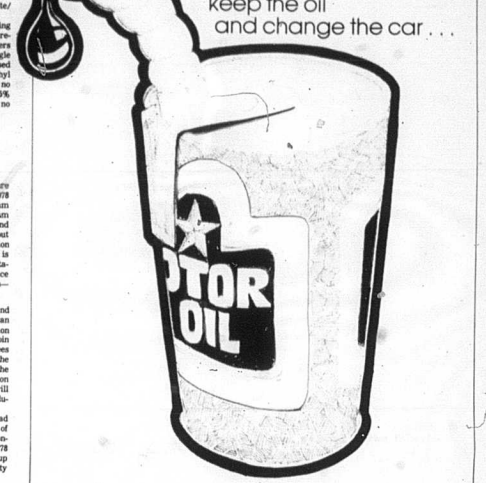
A list of the first pesticides to be classified for restricted use by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) includes materials widely used to control insects that damage crops in Kentucky.
