Children's psychiatrist at Comprehensive Care

Dr. H. Reuben Lettman, a Louisville psychiatrist in private practice, has joined the children's service staff of the Bluegrass West Comprehensive Care Centers on a part-time basis.

The appointment, effective this week, was announced by Thomas M. Layton, executive director of the Bluegrass Regional Mental Health—Mental Retardation Board, governing body of Comprehensive Care Centers in 17 counties.

Dr. Lettman will serve children and their families in the seven counties of Franklin, Anderson, Woodford, Scott, Bourbon, Harrison and Nicholas. The local center is at 226 Locust Street.

His appointment is the second major one to be made to the children's staff in the last two months. Dr. Carol Lowrey, a psychologist, joined the staff full-time Sept. 1.

Dr. Lettman will spend Wednesdays in the program, with headquarters at 91 Doctors' Drive in Frankfort.

Dr. Lettman is a native of Montreal, Canada, and received a diploma in psychiatry from McGill University there in 1960.

He received his M.D. degree from the University of Louisiana, Switzerland, in 1961. He has also studied at Queen's University and the University of Toronto.

He came to Louisville in 1976 to be medical director of the Jefferson Comprehensive Care Center. He also taught at the University of Louisville.

He went into private practice in Louisville earlier this year.

During 13 years in private practice in Lewiston, Maine, he held numerous positions as a psychiatric consultant and was a staff psychiatrist at several hospitals.

His positions include chief of the department of psychiatry at Central Maine General Hospital in Lewiston, director of child psychiatry at Pizeland Hospital and consultant psychiatrist to the State of Maine. He also was psychiatrist to the United States for the Armed Forces Entrance and Examining Station at Portland.

From Maine Dr. Lettman went to Israel for a year as director of the Herzliyah Community Mental Health Clinic.
