## Lori S. Ewen has honor of becoming first woman to receive B.S. degree in agricultural engineering

In December, Lori S. Ewen of Middletown, will become the first woman ever to receive a B.S. degree in agricultural engineering from the University of Kentucky. Lori does her share of work in the UK Department of Agricultural Engineering, machine shop, shop of electrical, drilling and welding metal. Lori currently is working with machine shop on a project to develop a new corn planter that would function better in adverse planting conditions.



A number of her research interests at UK is to investigate the possibilities for using solar energy in grain drying. Before transferring to UK, Lori was a student at Transylvania University, Lexington, where she majored in mathematics for two years.

"I did not want to become a math teacher so I decided to change to engineering," she said. "I have always enjoyed farm life since I was a child and visited my grandfather on his farm in Indiana." Lori says her dream is to someday own a farm.

When Lori attended her first agricultural engineering class at UK she was the only girl in the class and was well-conscious for the first few days. She has no intention that feeling, she says, and thanks her parents as an equal to the men students.

Lori has accepted a full-time staff position in the UK Department of Agricultural Engineering where her employment begins in January.

Lori has been active with the Council of Women Engineers, an affiliate of the National Association of Women (NAEW). She also has served as treasurer of the UK student chapter of the American Society of Agricultural Engineers.

Her leisure time activities include fishing and canoeing in Red River Gorge and reading, preferably science fiction.

Lori is not only the first woman scheduled for graduation from the UK Department of Agricultural Engineering — at 5 feet 7 and 100 pounds, she is also the smallest. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward T. Ewen Jr., of 218 Westwood Dr., Middletown 40021.
