Tax case Judgment published

[Editor's note: The following judgment was rendered last week by Nicholas Circuit Judge John P. Lair in the Class Action Tax Assessment case heard on Sept. 25. Several persons have asked us about the Judgment, therefore, we are printing it in its entirety as follows.]

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. This action may and should be prosecuted as a Class Action. 2. All persons owning property in Nicholas County who received notice by first class mail of increased assessment pursuant to KRS 125.450 are to be in Class A and a list thereof is to be made forthwith by the PVA and filed with the record together with names and addresses. 3. That this class may proceed and seek redress under the normal remedies provided by law. 4. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. That all taxpayers were entitled to notice of increased assessments according to law. 2. That the assessment increase on the property owned by those who did not receive notice was invalid. 3. That the action is a Class Action and the subject of a Declaratory Judgment. 4. That this Court does not have the authority to tell the PVA the Department of Revenue what the assessment of any property should be in Nicholas County, but that said assessments should be equalized as nearly as possible and made without discrimination. 5. That emergency assessment shall be made forthwith by the Department of Revenue and shall not be in excess of fair market value of the property. 6. That the restraining order must be dissolved. 7. That the temporary injunction is denied.

JUDGMENT

1. For the class of persons represented by Plaintiffs, excluding Sub-Class A, the 1977 tax assessments are hereby declared invalid and the certification of equalized assessment issued by the Defendant, Department of Revenue, is hereby set aside and held for naught. 2. The Defendant, Department of Revenue, is hereby ordered and directed to conduct an emergency assessment of the taxable property of Nicholas County pursuant to KRS 125.460 and in addition to compliance with the provisions of said statute, further to give notice to any member of the class whose assessment
