If your garden is bursting at the seams with fresh vegetables and you have canned tomatoes all you feel you will need, give to your friends and neighbors, here is a new twist to utilize those wonderful fresh vegetables. Make the vegetables into salad relishes to take along on picnics. There will still be wonderful vegetables for that, give as gifts, or enjoy with cold meats or sandwiches.

Each of these relishes is prepared in a special dressing which can be stored in the refrigerator for up to a week or longer. One is a take off on the famous Gaspacho Soup with alternating layered vegetables and a tasty marinade.

- GAZPACHO RELISH SALAD**
 1/2 cup bottled Italian dressing
 1/2 cup tomato sauce
 1/2 cup onion, finely chopped
 1 medium green pepper, cut into thin strips
 1 medium cucumber, sliced
 1 medium tomato, cut into wedges
 1 cup sliced celery
 In small bowl, blend Italian dressing, tomato sauce, onion, and green pepper. In separate jar, layer green pepper, cucumber, tomato, and celery, and dressing mixture between each layer. Secure lid tightly and chill, turning jar occasionally, 8 hours or overnight. Store in refrigerator for up to a week. Makes 4 cups relish.
- RATATOUILLE RELISH SALAD**
 1/2 cup bottled Italian dressing
 1/2 cup tomato sauce
 1/2 cup onion, finely chopped
 1/2 cup sliced parsnips
 1/2 cup sliced green pepper
 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms
 1/2 cup sliced eggplant, parsnips all 1/2" thick
 1 cup chopped tomato
 Parboiled mushrooms and eggplant (don't over-cook). Peel tomatoes. In small bowl blend Italian dressing, onion, and parsnips. In 1 quart jar layer green pepper, parsnips, tomato and eggplant, add dressing mixture after each layer. Proceed as above. Keeps one week, makes about 4 cups.
- CALICO CORN RELISH**
 2 1/2 cups cooked corn
 1 cup finely sliced celery
 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
 1/2 cup finely chopped pimiento
 1/2 cup bottled Italian dressing
 1/2 cup tomato sauce
 In a large bowl, combine all ingredients. Spoon into 1 quart jar; secure lid tightly and chill, turning jar occasionally, eight hours or overnight. Makes about 4 cups.
