## AMMONIA FROM COAL Demonstration plant contract to be signed

FRANKFORT—Gov. Julian Carroll and U.S. Senators Walter "Dew" Hayden and Wendell Ford said recently the final contract will be signed next week for initial work on a demonstration plant near Henderson to produce ammonia from coal.

The U.S. Energy and Research and Development Administration (ERDA) and the W.R. Grace Co., New York, are about ready to sign the contract for phase 1 of a project to design and construct the demonstration facility. Elanco Services, Inc., a New York-based construction firm, will do the detailed engineering design work and construct the facility.

If everything goes as planned in phase 1, Grace will be eligible for funding of phases 2 and 3—which consist of actual plant construction.

The \$23 million plant, which is scheduled to be operational by mid-1982, will use approximately 1,000 tons of coal a day to produce 1,200 tons of ammonia, which in turn will be used to make fertilizer.

The project was attracted to Kentucky, Gov. Carroll said, by the state's making land options available and by administrative and technical assistance provided by the Kentucky Center for Energy Research.

### Reunion

Sen. Haddleton said, "This project looks great promise for American agriculture and for coal production in Western Kentucky. It is further evidence of Kentucky's leadership in coal research." Haddleton praised officials of W.R. Grace Co., Elanco Services, Inc. and the Kentucky Center for Energy Research for their efforts in obtaining the project.

Sen. Ford said he was "extremely excited about the potential of this facility because it will provide a new use for coal and the byproduct will be clean, which we've been looking for as we turn to coal as the answer to our present energy shortage."

He said the plant will provide a new market for coal and a new source of energy. The plant will produce a clean, high quality coal gas which will be used to produce ammonia.
