of this gene. Current research funded by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation is seeking a practical test to identify those carriers, as well as a cure for C.F. and better methods of treatment for all lung-damaging diseases.  
Because of improved treatment developed through research, many C.F. patients are now living into their teens and young adulthood. This same treatment is also benefiting and often curing children suffering from other lung-damaging diseases. Even with this progress, the need of millions of children who struggle to breathe grows larger, and with it the need for more volunteers and more funds, Mrs. Robinson said.
