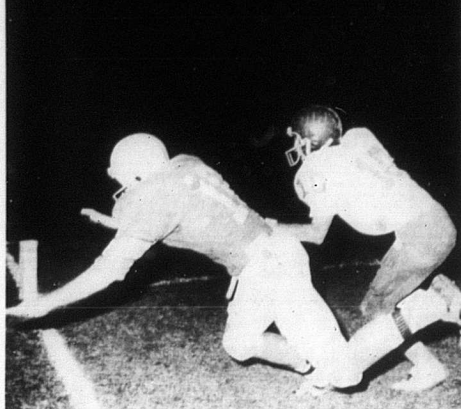


Jackets overpower bigger Beechwood 22-8 here Friday

Nicholas County was full of surprises Friday night, playing a near perfect game here, as they defeated Beechwood 22-8, a team that had not been scored against so far this season.

The first surprise was instantaneous as Cliff Thompson, after a hand-off from Greg Williams, returned the opening kickoff 46 yards, another gave the Jackets a two-point conversion score when punter Tim Moreland faked an extra-point kick and completed a pass to Thompson, the third touchdown Nicholas County with their final touchdown as Moreland completed a pass to Jimmy Price after lining up for a fake field-goal attempt on Beechwood's seven-yard line.

Nicholas County's first touchdown came in the beginning of the second quarter, after Joe Ruddle completed a 16 yard pass to Timmy Olinek, the Beechwood nine-yard line. Two plays later Thompson charged seven yards for the score. The two-point conversion play from Moreland to Thompson was good, leaving the Jackets ahead 8-0 at the end of the first half.

The Jackets' second touchdown came mid-way through the third quarter when Thompson, using some rifty broken-field running, dashed 90 yards for the score. Moreland's first of two extra-point kicks was good. The most unbelievable touchdown of the game, the pass from Moreland to Price, came late in the third quarter a few plays after pass interception by Joe Ruddle

who roared 77 yards to the Beechwood 13 yard line. This ended the quarter with the Bluejackets leading 22-0.

Although Beechwood had a much larger team in size, Nicholas County held them scoreless until mid-way through the fourth quarter. Beechwood's only touchdown was set up after a hand pass to the Jackets' punter, (probably the only Jacket mistake of the game), who downed the ball on his own 18 yard line. Beechwood proceeded to complete a pass to the nine-yard line. Three plays later Doug Morrison played a pass to get Beechwood's only score of the game. Their attempt for the two-point conversion was good, and the game ended with Nicholas County victorious over Beechwood 22-8.

Nicholas County's offensive leader was Cliff Thompson who carried the

ball 14 times for 77 yards. Allen Atkinson was next carrying the ball 11 times for 27 yards.

The Bluejackets' defense was led by Dewane Williams, James Anderson, and Mike Berry, who each had eight tackles. Ron Troner, Timmy Ockertman, Joe Ruddle and Cliff Thompson followed with six. Ricky Fryman had five and he recovered one fumble. Kevin Gillison and Rudy Handgahl had three tackles each. Handgahl also blocked a pass to the nine-yard line. Three plays later Doug Morrison played a pass to get Beechwood's only score of the game. 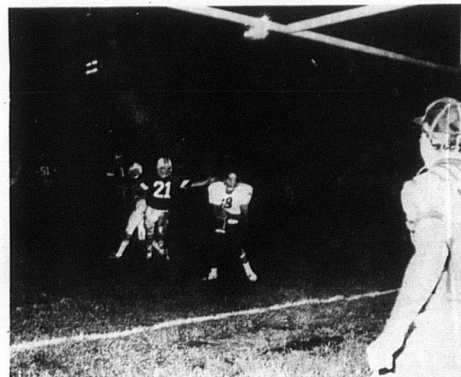
